2008 American Community Survey: 175,621 Montanans without Health Insurance Coverage

Summary

Census Bureau data released today shows that 175,621 Montanans, or 18.5% of the population, lacked health insurance coverage in 2008. That number would be significantly higher without public insurance options such as Medicare, Medicaid, and Children's Health Insurance. An additional 234,834 Montanans, or 24.7% of the population, are covered by public health insurance. The numbers for 2009 will likely be much worse because we are now deeper into the recession
